

We are not wholly bad or good...

irst published in the year I was born, its author had died in New York only a few months earlier. It was part of the syllabus for my A-level English studies. It stood out from the others works that we had to study (such as Huxley's *Brave New World* and Orwell's 1984) in that it was, in places, laugh-out-loud funny. Unusually, for all the copies of the book that have been published, in more than thirty languages, it was never meant to be read so much as to be heard. The author made that clear in the sub-title that he gave to his work: A Play for Voices. I have in mind, of course, Under Milk Wood by Dylan Thomas.



For many years I had a boxed-set recording of the first BBC radio production, which featured Richard Burton as the 'First Voice'. Burton was still in his twenties when he recorded it and yet had already developed his richly-rounded voice, although with hardly a trace of his original Welsh accent.

In that same BBC production, the voiced part of the 'Rev. Eli Jenkins' was played by Philip Burton, who was a school teacher in South Wales. He had wanted to be a professional actor and was said to have been looking for

a young protégé through whom he could achieve an acting success. The arrival of Richard Jenkins as a pupil in his school was to prove such an opportunity. The boy eventually became his legal ward and so took his surname – and became Richard Burton.




he play *Under Milk Wood* will be performed as a 'dramatized reading' as part of the Burford Festival, in a single evening performance on **Saturday 18 June**. I am delighted to be involved, playing the part of the 'Rev. Eli Jenkins', along with a great cast of local people, including Joanna McKerlie of Windrush.

In Jenkins, the character of a church minister is kindly drawn. A poet, though clearly of modest talent, and a local historian whose 'great book' remains unpublished, he clearly loves the people and the place to which he has been called with a true affection. His 'Sunset Prayer', towards the end of the play, offers this by way of supplication to God:

'We are not wholly bad or good who live our lives under Milk Wood, And Thou, I know, wilt be the first to see our best side, not our worst.'

Here is a good example, as so often happens in our prayers, of 'spiritual projection'. That is, of projecting what we are like onto God and of hoping that the divine nature is much the same. So Jenkins, being a kindly and tolerant type, expects that God will be just like him. Over the years I have heard and seen people describe God in ways that reveal far more about them than about God.



The festival of Pentecost falls on the first Sunday of June this year. Outside of church walls, it is the least observed of the 'big three' Christian festivals of Christmas, Easter and Pentecost. This year it will be overshadowed because it coincides with our Platinum Jubilee celebrations. Like Eli Jenkins, we may think of ourselves as being 'not wholly bad or good' but it has always taken far more than merely a kindly tolerance to really change lives, to transform them for the better — as the annual observance of Pentecost makes plain. ❖
