HIM - AN 'ORDINARY' PERSON?

John Malseed may not have been the first or only person to do it but he is the only one who I have ever met who has done it. And what's more, he did it twice, the second time when he was 65 years old.

John was a remarkable fellow who rode his 'penny-farthing' bicycle, (which for historical reasons is called an 'ordinary' by enthusiasts), from Land's End to John o'Groats, a distance of some 900 miles. John restored his 1880s highwheeler and would be seen around the area in which he lived using it as if it was a normal form of transport.

John had other claims to fame: it was he who made the fibre-glass model of *The Yellow Submarine*, which was used to promote The Beatles' 1968 film of that name. So successful was that model, that it was licenced to Corgi Ltd, who issued a die-cast model of it as a children's toy; John also made a 'trandem' for use in *The Goodies* TV series in the 1970s.

THEM - 'SILLY' PERSONS?

Why is the county of Suffolk sometimes called 'Silly Suffolk'? Far from being an insult or an estimation of the sense of the people, it came from a Saxon phrase, 'Selig Suffolk', where 'selig' meant holy or innocent, and the nickname was actually pointing out the great number and fine style of the county's church buildings. This county of Gloucestershire is also richly endowed by history with fine church buildings.

So, as the Priest-in-Charge of this group of churches, I thought that I too should be 'silly' (in the Suffolk sense) and ride a bicycle between our five churches and take part in five separate services which were happening on the same morning - and so also be 'silly' in the usual sense. The services will be celebrating Harvest Festival, so check the Calendar to find the time of the service in your village — and do, please, take part in some way.

On Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 September, which is the Annual 'Ride & Stride' weekend, many other people will be riding or walking between churches as part of a nationwide fundraising effort for churches and chapels.
