JUBILEE, JUBBLY and JUBILATION

On **Sunday 6 February** our Queen will have reached the 70th anniversary of her Accession. Whether one is a royalist, republican or rather indifferent, this Platinum Jubilee provides us all with done so. A centenary, yes, and in the case of the a remarkable, significant and poignant season in our USA, a bi-centenary; and in San Marino in the year nation's story. There will be a special service at 11 a.m. in Sherborne church to mark this anniversary.

It is **significant** because there are so few nations left, outsde of the Commonwealth, that mark a jubilee. As far as I am aware, no republic has ever 2000, four centuries of their constitution - but never a jubilee.

This word 'jubilee', so rich in meaning, is deeply embedded in a belief both in God's sovereignty and spiritual rescue. It is derived from the Hebrew for a ram's horn [yobhel] because in Old Testament

times this was blown from the hilltops as 'a trumpet -blast of liberty'. The sound announced a biblical (see Leviticus 25) invitation to celebrate every 50th year (i.e. when 7 x 7 years had passed) as

being one of God's favour, and a time when debts


were to be cancelled, prisoners set free and the

land was to lay fallow.



It is remarkable because so few monarchs have ever lasted this long. Currently fourth in the table of longest-reigning monarchs of sovereign states (with verifiable reigns by exact date), even before the celebrations in June of this year, the Queen will have moved into second place, behind Louis XIV of France, whose record reign of 72 years and 110 days is now something that we may yet see Her Majesty live to surpass.





As an aside, a 'not many people know that' kind of titbit; the 1960s children's iced juice treat, a 'Jubbly', was a corruption of the word 'jubilee'. The Jewish firm Rakusens had developed the first tetrahedral cardboard pack for liquids in their 'jubilee' year, and this package and name was adopted by Calypso drinks of Wrexham for their 'Jubbly' frozen drinks. As Del Boy later observd, "lubbly jubbly!"

JUBILEE, JUBBLY and JUBILATION

The Platinum Jubilee is **poignant** because we are, inevitably, nearer to the end of our Queen's reign than its beginning. On the day of her coronation Her Majesty said this:

"I am sure of this, my coronation is not the symbol of a power and splendour that has gone but a declaration of our hopes for the future, and for the years I may, by God's Grace and Mercy, be given to reign and serve you as your Queen."

Now, towards the end of her reign, who can doubt that the prayer, found as part of our National Anthem – 'long to reign over us' – has been answered in full?



It is particularly poignant for Christians because, unlike those in immediate line of succession, the Queen has identified herself as holding a clear Christian faith, one which is distinguished by its confidence and openness to others. This is how Her Majesty expressed it soon after her Diamond Jubilee:

"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace... is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, He stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people, of whatever faith or none."

During this Platinum Jubilee year we will, hopefully, enjoy a time of jubilation. We may also find that this time is tinged with sadness, however grateful may be our memories of her long reign, and for being a part of our respective communities.

Endings inevitably remind us of our mortality, our frailty. But for Christians they are never the last word. The Queen acknowledged this herself when, last year, she said:

"None of us can slow the passage of time; and while we often focus on all that has changed in the intervening years, much remains unchanged, including the Gospel of Christ and his teachings."

God save our gracious Queen!
