Finding Treasure in Ordinary Time

hat word comes to your mind when you think of *Summer*? High on the list is probably *heat*. Whether that is good or bad will depend to some extent on your personal thermostat. Another word likely to come to mind would be *holiday*. For those who have to live by school terms, summer will mean some time off and (planes, trains and the cost of car fuel permitting) time to get away to somewhere else and for things to slow down a bit. I wish you well if you are going away and say welcome to those who will be visiting this area throughout the Summer.

It is crucial for our well-being to have the time to take stock of what is most important, to slow down and look around, and to enjoy the love of family and friends. Of

course, God — who made us — understands this basic need. Indeed, the Church Calendar calls such a period 'Ordinary Time'. When God commanded a 'day of rest' (sabbath) every week, it was with our good in view.

Holidays allow some time for personal reflection. Jesus teaches us that "where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6:21); when we have time to see where our treasure is, that which we value most, then we will find our heart.

'If I were a medical man I should prescribe a holiday to any patient who considered his work important.'

So wrote Bertrand Russell when observing how often a symptom of an impending breakdown is the belief that one's work is indispensably important. Whilst we may rightly care about the work we do, we can surely recognise Russell's warning and, in the coming months, be glad to take his prescription.

Holidays are an opportunity to refresh ourselves and to restore a sense of perspective to all we are doing. But they are not free from danger, for we may have to relearn how to be part of a family or how to be on our own without the distraction or excuse of work.

olidays are when we can more easily recognise the truth of the well-known words of the Welsh poet W.H. Davies:

What is life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare?

If holidays are to live up to the origin of their name — and become for us *holy days* — then we would do well to seek God's renewal and perspective-restoring truths, rather than rely on our own strength for all that lies ahead for us. Part of any holiday we take should also include a care for our spiritual health and vitality. This can, of course, be done without ever leaving home.


Here is a spiritual workout than can easily be done while on holiday: take time to sit with your thoughts

and notice where your mind goes when it is unoccupied. Discover 'where your treasure is' by following those thoughts. How long does it take before God enters the picture? Where is faith among your values? A far less distracted mind can tell us a lot, if we only pay attention to it.

Every holiday, whether exciting and exotic or routine and familiar, will be lacking unless God is part

of our rest. This does not mean a beach has to be replaced with a monastery, or time with family replaced by a locked door. The grandeur of the sea and the laughter of children are easy paths to God for those who pay attention. And for those who cannot get away, then to worship with visitors who join us on Sunday can be a reminder that we are part of the larger family of God.

To view Summer, or for that matter 'Ordinary Time', as a time off from Christian fellowship is to mis-place Church into the category of 'the things to get away from'. In fact, God is always present during our holidays and is always inviting us to enjoy a deeper rest in Him. Let holy days be high on your list of priorities this Summer and discover that God is, wherever you go. *




